Knox told of concern of loss of revenue to the Harbor Fund, stated personal property tax doesn't levy a lot of revenue however, takes large amount of staff time and some boats are not in the harbor. Gorman wondered if postponing would be beneficial with

regards to Assembly attendance and in order to have the Assessor available and told of challenges of private moorages and trailered vessels. Hunter thought if staff had more time to concentrate on real property rather than personal property, inequalities and values of real property could be improved upon as well as it aids in meeting requirements of the State Assessor.
