

Lake-Hirst-Monastery-Kinkead Project #90843

Background

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) and the City and Borough of Sitka code require the CBS Assembly to approve low-interest loan funding. The CBS Assembly in Ord. 2023-07 adopted the FY2024 budget which included the authorization of the additional loan amounts that have been applied for through ADEC. The resolution being presented now is required by ADEC for the Municipal Administrator to execute the loan agreements.

The Lake-Hirst-Monastery-Kinkead project includes replacing the water and sewer lines under that section of road and storm drains and repaving. Each fund pays for the replacement of assets it owns, so the loans will be repaid by the Water and Wastewater Funds.

Analysis

The overall estimated cost of this project, including design and construction is \$8.6M. ADEC loans already accepted are a clean water (wastewater) loan for \$1.25M and a drinking water loan for \$1.5M. Added loan amounts in this resolution are \$1.705M. The CBS will fund the remainder through a combination of working capital contributed from the Water, Wastewater, and General Funds.

ADEC Loans: \$4,455,000 CBS Funds: \$5,002,288 This project is identified as a priority project in the CBS 2023 Water and Sewer Master Plan and has met all fiscal sustainability and cost-effectiveness requirements.

Fiscal Note

The cost to the CBS for the proposed and current loans are included in the current fiscal year budget and will not result in further increases to user rates. While the current project cost estimate is considerably below the total project budget, this represents a healthy contingency going into construction bidding. Any unused CBS funding (identified as working capital in the project coversheet) will be returned to the respective contributing funds at the end of the project.

Given the current market trends for municipal bonds, (which if the Bond Buyer's Municipal Bond Index Current Day Yield to Maturity is higher than 4% can increase the interest rate on the loan) rates are anticipated to be 1.5% APR.

Recommendation

Adopt this resolution authorizing the municipal administrator to sign and execute the loans offered under Clean Water and Drinking Water loan programs.
