PROMOTING ADOPTION WITHIN SITKA (PAWS)

Detailed Project Description Overview

Friends of the Sitka Animal Shelter (FOSAS) is applying under the Community Development Category.

FOSAS is dedicated to providing quality care to animals in need while offering resources, services, and education to community members. FOSAS aims to improve the lives and well-being of animals that live at the Sitka Animal Shelter as well as provide community engagement, outreach, education and support to the pet owners of Sitka and surrounding communities. The support we give to our community is supplemental to the Sitka Animal Shelters normal services.

The animal shelter is, at times, overrun with feral cats and kittens captured, or domestic cats surrendered, and the occasional abandoned dog as well. FOSAS mostly works with Sitka Residents; however, a few animals have been adopted out to other communities in Southeast Alaska. As a relatively new organization, we are excited to offer new programs and services to the community to facilitate adoptions and promote the human-animal bond. The Sitka Animal Shelter usually has 10 - 20 cats and 1-5 dogs at any given time and while they do receive some care while at the shelter, we know it is best for their mental and physical health and well-being to be placed in a home as soon as possible. Because of this, promoting adoptions within Sitka is one of our top priorities that will benefit the health and welfare of both the animals and citizens of our community.

We will use the funds to promote community health and welfare by facilitating adoptions and providing resources and education to adoptees through providing adoption kits. We will assemble and distribute 100 adoption kits, reaching 100-400 people depending on family size. Each kit will provide food, treats, toys for the adopted animal and educational information for the owner on how to effectively welcome a new pet into their home. We will also provide vouchers for free obedience classes for our canine adoptions, providing new owners with the tools and skills needed to care for their new pet and create a smooth transition from shelter life to home life. The items inside the kits are purchased locally which will stimulate the local economy by supporting local business and services related to pet care. Adoption kits will be assembled and delivered by FOSAS board members and local volunteers.

The service will be provided within the next year.

FOSAS has not previously received a CBS General Fund Grant.

Expected Outcomes

FOSAS will measure success by the number of animals adopted over the grant cycle period and the success rate of each adoption. For each adoption, there will be a check in following one month to make sure the adopter and adoptee are a good fit. The educational resources placed in the kits will help support the community members during the first stages of welcoming a new pet into their home, reducing the chance of the animal being returned to the shelter. In addition, properly adopted and cared-for pets are less likely to contribute to the issues that spread diseases. FOSAS will ask the adopter to complete a short survey to find out if the adoption kits were useful and if there is any other way they can be supported throughout the adoption process to make sure both the animal and the owner feel successful.

Statement of Need

Successful animal adoptions can have a significant positive impact on community development in several ways: *Promotes Social Responsibility*: When individuals engage with adopting efforts, they contribute to a culture of empathy and responsibility. This compassion can extend to other aspects of community life, fostering a more caring and cooperative community.

Reduces Strain on Animal Control Services: By supporting successful adoptions, communities can reduce the number of animals in shelters and decrease the strain on the animal control officer. This helps ensure that resources can be allocated to other animal control duties.

Encourages Volunteerism: Engaging in animal adoption efforts can inspire community members to volunteer the time and skills, which can have a ripple effect, encouraging more wide-spread community service.

FOSAS will leverage other funds in the amount of \$1,000 which will be donated directly by the Board Members of FOSAS.

Organizational Capacity

FOSAS has been the fortunate recipient of several grants to nonprofits in our first two-plus years of operation. In each case we have assigned at least one board member to oversee execution and reporting to ensure appropriate use of funds, and reporting on outcomes. We have also taken great care to apply national standards when relevant, and to involve local artists and vendors where possible. Donors have included The White Elephant, the Sitka Chapter of Rotary International, the Sitka Legacy Foundation and Alaska Community Foundation. Outcomes have included production of adoption kits, renovation of shelter spaces, production and placement of a new shelter sign, and production of a calendar to highlight shelter animals and their need for forever homes. Where called for we have applied FOSAS-raised matching funds, and looked carefully at issues of sustainability and responsible stewardship. Our board draws from government, small business, veterinary, volunteer organization and international business, as well as nonprofit experience.

Community support comes in many different forms, but we would like to highlight our robust volunteer group which consists of Coast Guard members and their families, local high school students, children and their parents, visiting veterinary technicians, AmeriCorps volunteers, and students attending the Outer Coast College. Just as the animals benefit greatly from the care they received, our volunteers and visitors to the shelter benefit greatly from the positive interactions they have with the animals.

FOSAS Board meets on a monthly basis. Board Members: Kristina Tirman - President, Rhea Ehresmann - Vice-President, Dusty Kidd - Secretary, Susan Jones, Evann Kegley, Claire Turner, and Chris Kowalczowski.
