Through multiple channels, the City and Borough of Sitka has heard that now is the time to ask for State of Alaska lands. The Planning Commission is recommending a motion of support for a resolution requesting the identified state land parcels for future development and community growth. The motion was made at the March 15th Planning Commission and approved unanimously.

CBS continuously pursues possible land acquisitions, trades, etc. with focus on future community development. Current economic trends limit the State's ability for funding, but responding to needs for community growth through disbursement of lands could be an alternate route. Governor Walker has informally extended invitations for land requests to communities on the basis that the lands will be used for housing, community growth and/or economic development. While there is no guarantee that our request will be approved or considered, there is no harm in making the request.

Planning Staff has identified multiple State owned parcels that could be used for future housing, community growth and/or economic development purposes:

Parcel 1: Indian River Valley Parcel State of Alaska, Tentatively Approved Parcel 1443.32 acres

Parcel 2: Millersville

Department of Education, State of Alaska

Lot 15 E, Amended Japonski Island Subdivision Seward and Tongass Improvements

Parcel 3: Starrigavan/Katlian Bay State of Alaska, Tentatively Approved Parcel 1522.07 acres Lot 1 and 2, U.S.S. 5530

Parcel 4: Parcel at end of Seward Avenue Department of Education, State of Alaska

Upon approval, Staff will forward the resolution and supporting materials to Governor Walker and the Department of Natural Resources.
