10 11	AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF SITKA, ALASKA PROPOSING TO AMEND THE HOME RULE CHARTER OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF
12	SITKA TO RAISE THE PROPERTY TAX LIMIT FROM 6 MILLS TO 6.5 MILLS TO
12	PAY FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPAL INFRASTRUCTURE, EQUIPMENT AND ITS
14	MAINTENANCE, AND SUBMIT THIS CHARTER AMENDMENT AND QUESTION
15	TO THE VOTERS FOR RATIFICATION

17	1. <u>CLASSIFICATION</u> . This ordinance is of a permanent nature and includes at
18	Subsection 4A a provision intended to become a part of the Home Rule Charter of the City and
19	Borough of Sitka if approved by the voters at the October 4, 2011 regular election.
20	
21	2. <u>SEVERABILITY</u> . If any provision of this ordinance or any application to any
22	person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and application to any
23	person or circumstance shall not be affected.
24	
25	3. <u>PURPOSE.</u> The City and Borough of Sitka has municipal infrastructure and/or
26	equipment that needs to be purchased, replaced, repaired, and/or maintained. Current revenues
27	are limited to meet these needs. If ratified by the voters, this ordinance would amend the Sitka
28	Charter to raise the property tax limit from 6 mills to 6.5 mills, to fund such municipal
29	infrastructure, equipment, and its maintenance. The revenues gained from the property tax limit
30	increase will be used to pay for purchase, replacement, repair and/or maintenance, such as for
31	municipal owned buildings, structures, equipment, and roads, including Sitka Community
32	Hospital's new roof and new mammogram machine. The increased revenues will not be used for
33	infrastructure, equipment and its maintenance for schools and enterprise funds (e.g. electric;
34	harbors; water; wastewater; solid waste; Sawmill Cove Industrial Park; airport terminal; Marine
35	Service Center). The schools and the enterprise funds already have sources of revenues or
36	options to obtain such revenues regarding their infrastructure, equipment and its maintenance.

38	4. ENACTMENT. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Assembly of
39	the City and Borough of Sitka that:

40 47	The property tax levy shall not exceed six and one half tenths of one

49 50 51 52	assessed valuation of the property to be taxed. The voters may raise this limit by an affirmative vote of the majority of the voters participating in a special or regular election.
53 54 55 56	This section shall not in any way limit the ability of the municipality to meet its bonded obligations and in no event shall the property tax levy during a year exceed three percent (thirty mills) of the assessed value of the property in the municipality.

62 63 64	Shall the Charter of the City and Borough of Sitka be amended to raise the property tax limit from 6 mills to 6.5 mills, with any increased revenues used to fund certain municipal infrastructure and its maintenance?

68	Informational: The revenues gained from the property tax limit increase will be
69 70	used to pay for municipal infrastructure, equipment and its maintenance, such as
70 71	for municipal owned buildings, structures, equipment, and roads, including Sitka Community Hospital's new roof and new mammogram machine. The increased
72	revenues will not be used for infrastructure, equipment and its maintenance for
73	schools and enterprise funds (e.g. electric; harbors; water; wastewater; solid
74	waste; Sawmill Cove Industrial Park; airport terminal; Marine Service Center),
75	which have their own sources or better options for funding.
76	
77	5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective on the day after the
78	date of its passage. The amendment to the Home Rule Charter of the City and Borough of Sitka
79	set out in Subsection 4.A shall become effective on January 1, 2012 only if a majority of the
80 81	voters voting on this ballot proposition at the regular election on October 4, 2011 approve the
81 82	ballot proposition.
