22	1. <b>CLASSIFICATION.</b> This ordinance is of a permanent nature and is intended to		
23	become a part of the Home Rule Charter of the City and Borough of Sitka.

25	2. <b>SEVERABILITY.</b> If any provision of this ordinance or any application to any		
26	person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and application to any		
27	person or circumstances shall not be affected.

29	3. <b><u>PURPOSE.</u></b> The City and Borough owns and oversees the operation of Sitka		
30	Community Hospital. If ratified by the voters, this ordinance would amend the Home Rule		
31	Charter of the City and Borough of Sitka to create a dedicated fund for Sitka Community		
32	Hospital Roof, Equipment and Infrastructure. If ratified by the voters, this ordinance would		
33	amend the Charter to raise the property tax limit from 6 mills to 6.25 mills, create a dedicated		
34	Sitka Community Hospital Roof, Equipment and Infrastructure Fund that could only be used for		
35	a new roof, equipment or infrastructure, and require the deposit into that Fund of the revenues		
36	generated by that portion of any property tax levy between 6 mills and 6.25 mills, and require a		
37	public vote 10 years after its passage to reauthorize the increased millage rate and Fund		
38	provisions.

40	4. <b>ENACTMENT.</b> NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Assembly of		
41	the City and Borough of Sitka that:

43	A. The Home Rule Charter of the City and Borough of Sitka is hereby		
44	amended by amending Section 13.03, Property Tax Limit, to read as		
45	follows (new language underlined; deleted language stricken):

49 50 51 52 53 54	The property tax levy shall not exceed <u>six and one quarter tenths of one</u> <u>percent (6.25 mills)</u> six-tenths (0.006) of one per cent (6 mills) of the assessed valuation of the property to be taxed. The voters may raise this limit by an affirmative vote of the majority of the voters participating in a special or regular election.
55 56 57 58	This section shall not in any way limit the ability of the municipality to meet its bonded obligations and in no event shall the property tax levy during a year exceed three percent (thirty mills) of the assessed value of the property in the municipality.

104 105	Informational: Another public vote will occur in 10 years to continue the
105	increased property tax limit and the dedicated fund if this ballot
107	proposition is approved by the voters. The revenues gained from the
108	property tax limit increase will be placed in this fund, and can could only
109	be used to pay for Sitka Community Hospital's new roof, equipment and
110	infrastructure. For an example, Sitka Community Hospital is currently in
111	the need of a new roof and a new mammogram machine and this increase
112	in millage if passed would fund those.
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114 115	5. <b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This ordinance shall become effective on the day after the
115	date of its passage. The amendments to the Home Rule Charter of the City and Borough of Sitka
117	set out in Subsection 4.A and B shall <del>only</del> -become effective <u>on January 1, 2012 only</u> if a majority
118	of the voters voting on this <u>ballot proposition <del>ordinance</del></u> at the regular election on October 4,
119	2011 approve the ballot propositionthis ordinance, and if a majority-of voters-approve-then
120	those amendments set out in Subsection 4A and B shall become effective on January 1, 2012.
121	The amendments in Subsection 4.A and B are subject to another public vote in ten years for
122	reratification, if the ballot proposition is approved by the voters in the October 2011 election.
