20	3. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to add a provision in SGC Title 2
21	entitled "Administration" to create a local Health Needs and Human Services Commission
22	("HNHSC") and establish organizational guidelines for such a commission. HNHSC will serve
23	to address the health and social service needs and concerns of the community by undertaking
24	specified duties, including monitoring and periodically reporting on vital information and current
25	trends in health and human services, as requested by the Assembly of the City and Borough of
26	Sitka.

53	2.12.010 Health needs and human services commission.
54	There shall be a commission known as the health needs and human services commission
55	which shall be composed of seven members appointed by the Assembly and, to the extent
56	deemed advisable by the Assembly, include professionals from among the fields of health
57	and human services including medicine, psychology, public health, social services, public
58	safety, public administration and other related fields. A member of the Sitka Assembly will
59	serve as a liaison for the commission. All members of the commission shall be at-large
60	members and represent a diverse cross-section of the community.
61	
62	<u>2.12.020 Term.</u>
63	The term of a member shall be three years or until a successor is appointed; except, term of
64	the Assembly Liaison shall be for one year. The first members appointed to the commission
65	shall, upon appointment, determine the length of the terms so that the terms of two (2)
66	members shall be for one year and the terms of two (2) members shall be for two years, and
67	the terms of two (2) members shall be for three years, resulting in staggered terms for
68	members subsequently appointed. A vacancy on the commission shall be filled by
69	appointment by the Assembly for any remainder of an unexpired term.
70	
71	2.12.030 Meetings.
72	A. Meet a minimum of four times per year at such times that the chair or, in his or her
73	absence, the vice-chair shall determine.
74	
75	B. <u>Give reasonable public notice of its meetings and shall comply in all respects with the</u>
76	<u>Alaska Open Meetings Law.</u>
77	
78	<u>2.12.040</u> Organization. The commission shall organize itself by electing a chairman, vice chairman, and secretary,
79	each of whom shall be elected by the members of the commission at the first meeting of the
80	fiscal year and shall serve a term to expire upon election of officers at the first meeting of the
81 82	following fiscal year.

83	2.12.050 Resignation.
84 85	<u>Should an officer resign from their position prior to expiration of their term, or otherwise is</u>
	unable or unwilling to perform duties as required of the office, the commission may elect an
86 87	officer to serve out the remainder of that term. In addition to the above officers, the
87 88	commission, by a majority vote of its members, may designate and elect or appoint such
00	commission, by a majority vote of its memocas, may designate and elect of appoint such

89	other officers, assistant officers and agents as it deems necessary at such time, in such
90	manner, and upon and for such terms as it shall prescribe. All officers and agents shall serve
91	at the pleasure of the commission, whenever in its judgment the best interest of the
92	commission will be served.
93	
94	2.12.060 Powers and Duties.
95	A. The commission will annually identify goals developed through the collection and
96	consolidation of vital and current information on human service trends as well as public
97	input. All goals shall be approved by the Assembly prior to the commission initiating
98	action. All findings of the commission will be made available to benefit and educate city and
99	borough of Sitka decision-makers.
100	
101	B. The commission will perform other activities which are necessary and proper to carry out
102	the above duties and any other actions determined by the Assembly to be beneficial to carry
103	out the health and human service goals necessary in the city and borough of Sitka.
104	
105	C. The commission will coordinate with local entities such as the Sitka Tribe of Alaska, Sitka
106	Community Hospital, SEARHC as well as applicable non-profits and local businesses
107	providing health/human services to identify human service needs as well as to best streamline
108	the collection and consolidation of vital and current information on human service needs.
109	
110	5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective on the day after the
111	date of its passage.
