The Center for Community, Inc. hereby adopts the following Amended And Restated Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is The Center for Community, Inc.

ARTICLE II

This Corporation shall commence upon its being granted a corporate charter and shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSES

The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and may do any and all acts consistent therewith.

BYLAWS of THE CENTER FOR COMMUNITY, INC.

As amended by vote of the Board on June 28, 2011

SECTION ONE OFFICES

The principal office of the corporation shall be located at 700 Katlian Street, Suite B, Sitka, Alaska 99835. The corporation may have such other offices as approved by the board of directors.

SECTION TWO BOARD OF DIRECTORS

<u>GENERAL POWERS.</u> The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its board of directors. Directors shall be at least 18 years of age at the time of appointment. The current board of directors shall invite new persons to become directors.

NUMBER, TERM AND ELECTION. The number of directors shall be not less than five (5) nor more than nine (9). Directors shall be elected to the board by the other directors, which election may occur at any regular or special meeting of the board, and the term of office for a director shall be three (3) years, set to coincide with the fiscal year of the corporation. The terms of the directors shall be fixed so that no more than one-third of the seats on the board shall be elected at the beginning of each fiscal year. No employee shall be a voting member of the board of directors.

<u>V</u>ACANCIES. Any vacancy occurring on the board of directors shall be filled by the board of directors. A director appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve for the unexpired term of the director's predecessor in office.

REMOVAL. Any director elected or appointed to the board of directors may be removed by the board of directors whenever in its judgment the best interest of the corporation would be served thereby.

ATTENDANCE. Any director missing three regular meetings in any fiscal year without prior permission from the president of the board may be removed from the board.

QUORUM. A quorum is at least one half the number of currently filled board seats, or four, whichever number is higher. Ifless than a quorum of the directors is present at any meeting, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting without notice. Directors may attend the meeting via telephone or computer connection which allows all directors to hear all comments by all other directors, and a director attending in this manner may exercise all regular comment and voting powers. A director may not give his or her proxy to act as a director to any other person.

absence of such specifications, each officer shall have the powers and authority and shall perform and discharge the duties of officers of the same title serving in nonprofit corporations having the same or similar general purposes and objectives as this corporation.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. There shall be an executive director who shall be the active executive and administrative officer of the corporation and shall be charged with the direction of its activities in the accomplishment of its purposes, subject, however, to the direction, supervision, and control of the board of directors. The executive director shall be the official custodian of all papers, documents, books and records of this organization and shall perform such other duties as pertinent to this office or as assigned to the executive director by the president. The executive director shall render such reports as the board of directors requests.

SECTION FOUR **MEETINGS**

MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. A regular meeting of the board of directors will be held each year after and as near to the first day of July as possible, and thereafter at least once during each calendar quarter of the year at a location and time as the directors may determine

NOTICE OF MEETINGS. Notice of the regular meetings of the board of directors shall be given at least one (1) week prior to the regular meeting and shall be oral, in writing, or made by telephone, email, or internet posting, or delivered personally to each director.


SPECIAL MEETINGS. Special meetings of the board of directors may be called by or at the request of the President or any five (5) directors, and shall be held at the principal office of the corporation or at such other place as the directors may determine.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETINGS. Notice of any special meeting of the board of directors shall be given at least one (1) day prior to the meeting and shall be oral, in writing, or made electronic means, or delivered personally to each director.

All checks, drafts or order for the payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall be determined by resolution of the board of directors. In the absence of such determination by the board of directors, such instruments shall be signed by the last authorized signers.


