I <u>RES 11-15</u> To formally submit a Municipal Harbor Facility Grant application to the State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) in the amount of \$4,250,000 for the project entitled ANB Harbor Replacement.

Harbormaster Stan Eliason hoped the North and South entrances could be made wider. Eliason confirmed \$4,250,000 is half the cost.
