STONE REFERENCE MONUMENTS are marked with cross buried 6" in 18" below surface and located at intersection of center lines of streets indicated thus: \otimes
BLOCK CORNERS are spruce posts 4-4x4 in. long, driven 18 in. in ground.
LOT CORNERS are spruce posts, 1 1/2 x 2 1/2 in. long, driven 18 in. in ground.
Descriptions and locations of reference monuments are given in the field notes.
