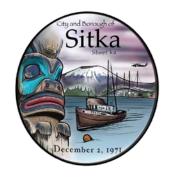

Grant Background

The <u>Transportation Alternatives</u> (TA) Set-Aside from the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program provides funding for a variety of generally smaller-scale transportation projects such as pedestrian and bicycle facilities; construction of turnouts, overlooks, and viewing areas; community improvements such as historic preservation and vegetation management; environmental mitigation related to storm water and habitat connectivity; recreational trails; safe routes to school projects; and vulnerable road user safety assessments.

The Call for Projects is broken into two phases. Phase one consisted of submission of a Notice of Intent to Apply (NOIA) that included project title, location, scope, short justification, and eligibility screening in order to be eligible for phase two call for projects. CBS submitted the NOIA and met with the Regional Planner to discuss scope, eligibility, management responsibilities, match requirements, estimating details, supporting documents, and more.

Phase 2 was a call for projects. DOT&PF used the preliminary project information to determine eligibility and prepare a scope, schedule, and estimate. CBS is responsible to develop the full project application.

Awarded projects will be developed and managed by ADOT&PF as this program does not issue grants to communities directly.

Criteria on a 0 to 5-point scale include: Health and quality of life, safety, contributions, M&O costs, public support, gaps/barriers, tied to an event, intrinsic qualities, historic transportation facility, capital cost, other factors.

TA grant key factors with updated dates/milestones:

 Applications are due February 28, 2023. Resolutions and financial commitments are due by the time the Statewide Project Evaluation Board Meets in May.

- Projects proposed on a roadway managed by DOT&PF and within the Right of Way (ROW) supported by ADOT&PF will cover the match.
- Additional funding provided by the community would be considered for additional points.
- The community is responsible for maintenance responsibility for the new facility and open to the public for at least 25 years.
- DOT&PF completes the scope, schedule, and estimate.
- This program is expected to award close to \$20-30 million for this award cycle.
- TA Projects are limited to two project submittals per public entity not to exceed federal share amount of \$5 million per submittal as determined by a DOT&PF certified estimate.
- Projects pre-scored and Project Evaluation Board (PEB) selections will be made April 21, PEB applications submitted by DOT&PF planning in partnership with community May 15, PEB will meet May 30-31.

Project Background

Kittelson & Associates, Inc. (Kittelson) and Huddle AK prepared a tourism focused traffic study, and to conduct related stakeholder outreach, building upon the *Sitka Short-Term Tourism Plan* prepared by CBS staff in advance of the 2022 summer tourist season. Observations included significant pedestrian crossing activities across Harbor Drive between Harrigan Centennial Hall and Lincoln Street of more than 3,000 pedestrians on high volume cruise ship days. The curvature of Harbor Drive along with tall buildings on the northwest side of the road makes it more dangerous for those pedestrians crossing at that blind spot.

The project is to design and construct a pedestrian crossing improvement across Harbor Drive between Maksoutoff Road and Harrigan Centennial Hall. The crossing may include a traffic control device such as a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) or Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB). Lighting improvements may also be installed. The final design will be in compliance with the Alaska Traffic Manual and supported by engineering analyses.

This crossing is supported by the 2002 Sitka Non-Motorized Transportation Plan; 2022 Traffic Study; and Goal 1 Quality of Life from the Strategic Plan and 4.4.

Fiscal Note

The total project cost is \$1,510,000. Direction was given at the February 28th Assembly meeting to include an additional 5.01% (\$75,651) local match contribution for 3 points from the Commercial Passenger Excise Tax Fund in addition to the State minimum contribution of 9.03%.

Please note that in addition to any match the Assembly approves, ADOT will require that the CBS take on future maintenance for any newly built facilities.

Recommendation

Approve this resolution authorizing the Municipal Administrator to apply for and execute a Transportation Alternatives (TA) program grant for the State Right of Way Harbor Drive Improvement Safe Pedestrian Crossing Project and include a 5.01% match commitment from the Commercial Passenger Vessel Excise Tax Fund.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF SITKA (CBS) AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATOR TO APPLY FOR AND EXECUTE A GRANT FOR THE TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES SET-ASIDE FROM THE SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM WITH THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES (ADOT&PF) FOR THE STATE RIGHT OF WAY HARBOR DRIVE IMPROVEMENT SAFE PEDESTRIAN CROSSING PROJECT

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WHEREAS, the CBS received a request from the ADOT&PF to nominate projects for inclusion in the Transportation Alternatives (TA) Set-Aside from the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program as outlined in the ADOT&PF's application packet; and

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18 19 WHEREAS, with the increase of the visitor industry specifically the cruise ship passenger projections along with the shuttle operation to Harrigan Centennial Hall for passenger disembarking, the CBS recognizes the need to create a safer crossing across Harbor Drive near Harrigan Centennial Hall; and

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WHEREAS, the CBS is participating as an eligible project sponsor in the ADOT&PF Transportation Alternatives Program with federal monies available, administered by ADOT&PF, for the purpose of creating and promoting the planning and development of alternative transportation projects in Alaska; and

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WHEREAS, the CBS acknowledges the State will pay the 9.03% match requirement since it is a project on State right of way and recognizes the opportunity for a local match commitment and the availability of funds, understanding that more points are scored for a higher match; and

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WHEREAS, the CBS acknowledges the scope, schedule, and estimate confirmation prepared by the State of Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities Southcoast Region; and

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WHEREAS, the CBS agrees the facility constructed with federal transportation funds be maintained by the CBS and open to the public for at least 25 years; and

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WHEREAS, after appropriate public input and due consideration, the governing body of the CBS has recommended that an application be submitted with a local match commitment to the State of Alaska for the State Right of Way Harbor Drive Improvement Safe Pedestrian Crossing Project.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Assembly of the City and Borough of Sitka to authorize the CBS Municipal Administrator to apply for and execute a grant with ADOT&PF for the Transportation Alternatives Program with a match commitment of 5.01% totaling \$75,651 from CBS Commercial Passenger Vessel Excise Tax Fund.
