Dear Assembly Members

Thank you for the opportunity to submit my application for the newly created Tourism Task Force.

I have been a year round resident of Sitka for 45+ years. I have worked in and have gained perspective of many different industries from fish processing and commercial long lining to Director of Sail, Sitka, Director of Convention Sales at the Sitka Visitors Bureau and Director of Sitka Whalefest, among others.

Having served the community of Sitka as an Assembly member for 6+ years my education on how the City functions, our financial condition as well as the benefit and challenges of many of our residents was greatly enhanced.

I have traveled a fair amount to quite a few different countries. I have always had a keen interest in the tourism industry and the effects it has on communities. In many cases I have been very sad to see the changes that have come about as a result of high numbers of visitors, in others the effect appears fairly minimal, or at least less obvious. One thing is constant, there is change and change can be difficult.

In Southeast Alaska the changes, due to the visitor industry, and primarily the cruise ship sector, have been remarkable. Several of our communities are nearly unrecognizable from what they were even 30 years ago. We in Sitka have so far been able to hold off some of the most dramatic changes. Only a few of our store fronts have their windows papered over and doors locked as the cruise ships pull out and there has been a fairly slow decline of businesses operating year round. But, there are more each year and every one counts.

I believe we are at a huge turning point in the industry and time is of the essence to do all we can to secure a future for our community that can coexist with tourism and still maintain the high quality of life that keeps so many of us here. I would like to work together with others to hopefully find that critical balance.
