Dear CBS Assembly:

I am writing to convey my intent to reapply for a 3-year term seat on the Sustainability Commission and strong desire to continue to serve on this body. I have been on the Sustainability Commission since its inception in 2022 and would be honored to continue in this role. Since joining, I have gained experience in municipal governance, including my role as the Vice Chair in 2024 and currently as the Commission Chair. I am excited to continue to advance our priorities, most notably with my involvement on the Solid Waste Advisory Group that focuses on municipal solid waste initiatives with a subgroup of Commissioners and City staff.

My post-secondary education and professional experience have primed me to succeed at this role and offer technical insight into topics of sustainability. I have a Bachelor of Science in Climate Change and Environmental Science, and completed the UAS Fishery Technology Certification program in Sitka, with curricula focused on topics of renewable energy, ecosystem health, and Southeast Alaskan fisheries.

I worked for multiple years as Sitka Tribe of Alaska's Fisheries Biologist, focusing on shellfish biomass mapping and projections, harmful algal blooms, and Klag Bay sockeye escapement and monitoring. This position exposed me to the importance of local and Tribal stewardship and gave me practical knowledge of managing and implementing projects in and around Sitka. In my current role, I work remotely from Sitka with a Tribal Government in the Pribilof Islands, as the Environmental Grant Writer for the Aleut Community of St. Paul. As a grant writer for another Alaskan island community, I've gained substantial experience with planning and implementing environmental programs and infrastructure projects. My job includes many facets of developing and evaluating workplans, budgets, and reports under complex logistics while considering potential for positive impact. This technical experience within environmental contexts are all traits I will continue to bring to the Sustainability Commission.
