In an attempt to implement the changes to the SGC-8 the Animal Control Ordinance, which were approved by the Assembly around September of 2010, a couple of word changes/deletions have been discovered which need to be made to clarify the intent of the changes.

The intent of the changes in SGC 8.04.020 – Licensing was to give the public an opportunity to purchase a 3-year dog license for their dog. Because of the word "yearly" in section 8.04.020-B, it doesn't allow for a 3-year license. If the word "yearly" is taken out, the 3-year license can be implemented.

Also, section -D of SGC 8.04.020 needs to be deleted as it also conflicts with the intent to allow a 3-year license for dogs to be offered.

These two changes are of a housekeeping manner only, but need to be approved by the Assembly, before we can offer a three-year license to dog owners.

City Attorney Theresa Hillhouse has drafted up the proposed changes for the Assembly to review.
