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12 13	BE IT ENACTED by the Assembly of the City and Borough of Sitka as follows:
14 15	1. CLASSIFICATION. This emergency ordinance is not of a permanent nature and is not intended to be a part of the Sitka General Code of the City and Borough of Sitka.
16 17 18 19	2. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this emergency ordinance and application thereof to any person and circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of this emergency ordinance and application thereof to any person and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.
20 21 22	3. PURPOSE. The purpose of this emergency ordinance is recited as follows:
23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, Sitka is experiencing a substantial increase in COVID-19 cases which are primarily attributed to the Delta variant and Sitka has been in the COVID-19 high alert status, with steady positive tests and hospitalizations, and even a resident death, since July 5, 2021, and Sitka is currently experiencing one of the highest rates of persons testing positive for COVID-19; and
27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, the quarantine and isolation for 10 days for non-resident travelers who test positive for COVID-19 causes great financial hardships and inconvenience for those persons and their dependents; and
31 32 33	WHEREAS, federal financial support for persons required to quarantine and isolate expired on December 31, 2020; and
34 35 36 37	WHEREAS, a non-resident traveler to Sitka who tests positive for COVID-19 while in Sitka is required by the State of Alaska to quarantine and isolate for 10 days in Sitka before leaving Sitka; and
38 39 40 41 42	WHEREAS, the availability of lodging for those non-resident travelers who test positive such that they can quarantine and isolate for 10 days is currently severely limited, or maybe non-existent, and such limitation is expected to continue through the summer; and
43 44 45 46	WHEREAS, the circumstances described above have and will cause financial hardship and inconvenience to said non-resident travelers and, if said non-resident travelers fail to comply with the quarantine and isolation requirements, puts Sitkans at risk of increased COVID-19 infections.
47 48 49 50	4. ENACTMENT. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Assembly of the City and Borough of Sitka (CBS) that the City and Borough of Sitka will secure and pay for two lodgings, double occupancy, for the purpose of making them available to non-resident travelers who test

51 positive for COVID-19 and are required to guarantine and isolate in Sitka for 10 days. Any such traveler in need of lodging may request the same from the Municipal Administrator or his 52 53 designee. The traveler must pay the CBS in advance for the lodging. The funds for holding this 54 lodging shall be implemented with a supplemental appropriation from the CBS General Fund, not to exceed \$40,000.
