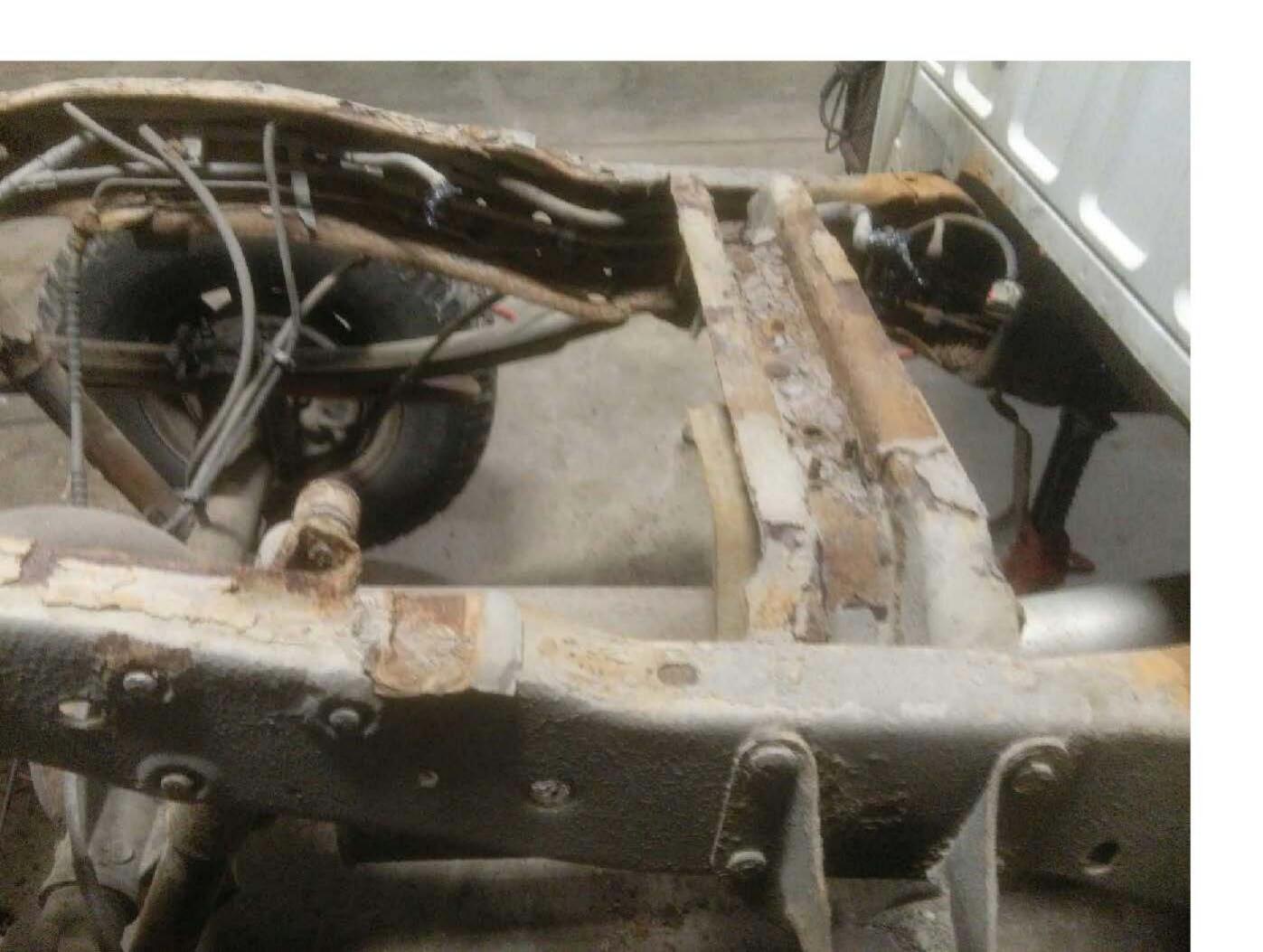

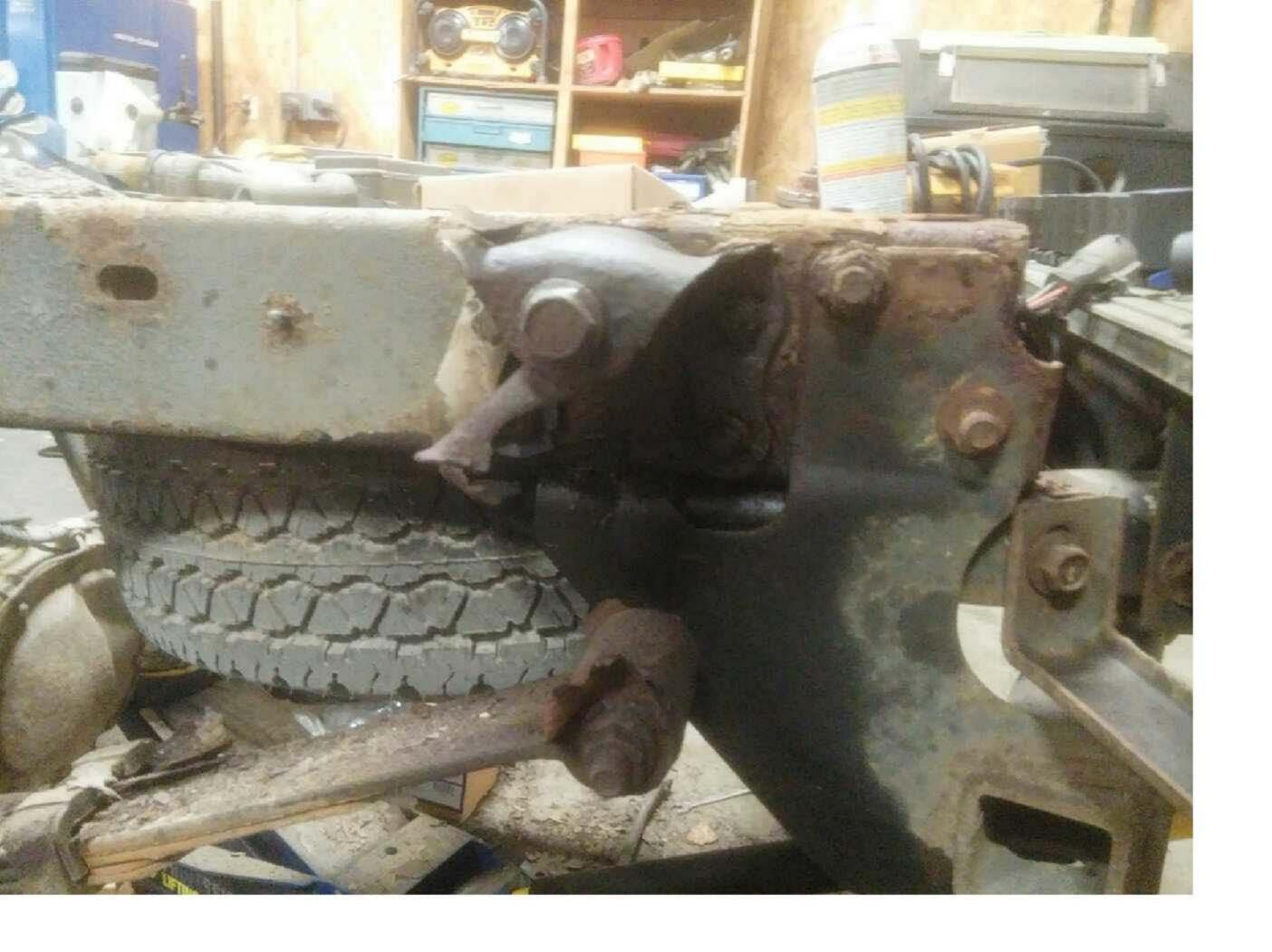
Central Garage Budget Meeting

I would like to share the attached photos to give a glimpse into some of the challenges that our Central Garage fleet is working through. These pictures are of Unit #362, a 2005 Ford Ranger with 50,000 miles. This vehicle happens to be used by our Public Works Water Division for routine sampling and general transportation. This vehicle is still in service today despite the severely rusted frame and other suspension components. One look at the exterior or interior of this vehicle and one would think that this a fairly new and dependable vehicle. This vehicle came in for a routine service inspection and it was discovered that the frame cross member, fuel tank support and leaf springs were rotten and failing. We removed the bed, replaced all failing components, stripped and treated all remaining rust and placed this vehicle back into service to get all remaining service life that we possibly can for the CBS fleet.

This is a widespread problem in our vehicle fleet with the average age of our vehicles increasing. The attached chart shows that 53% of our fleet vehicles are 11 years of age or older. The majority of our vehicles have a recommended life cycle replacement of 10 years from our Central Garage. The Central Garage is currently developing a fleet replacement plan to streamline this process in the future. We have created and included in your packet a vehicle replacement flowchart to easily answer the inquiries of whether a vehicle is ready for replacement or not and what to do with the vehicle once it has been replaced.

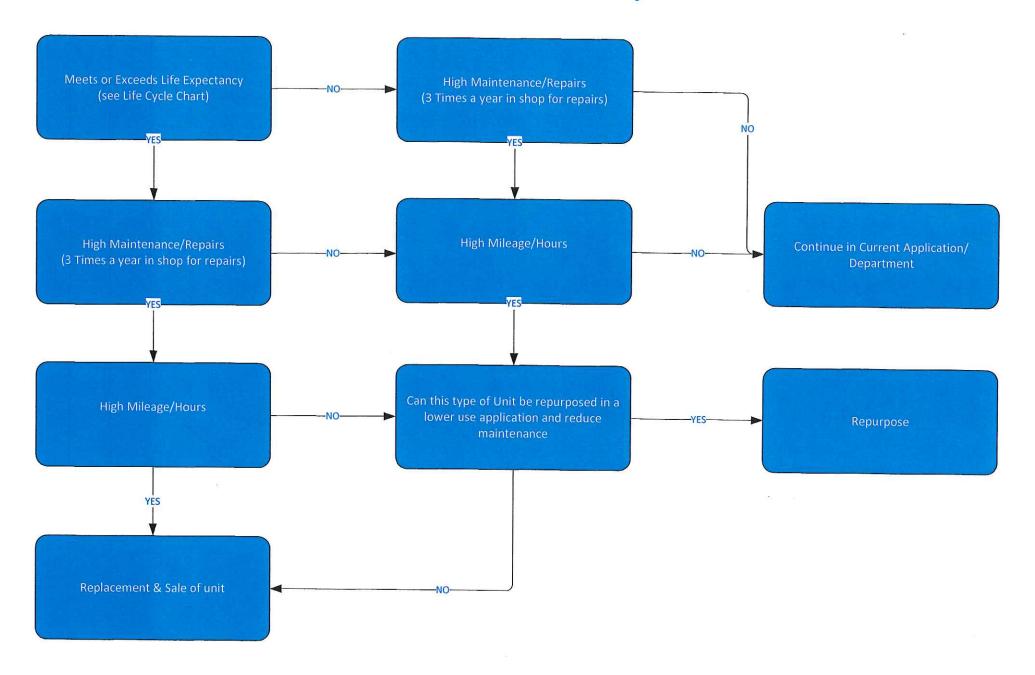
We are constantly looking at new ways to stretch the dollars in our budget. This year we are proposing to replace one of the rollover fleet vehicles with a used replacement rather than a new vehicle. This will not be a solution for every vehicle replacement, but will vary depending on the type of replacement and intended use of the vehicle.



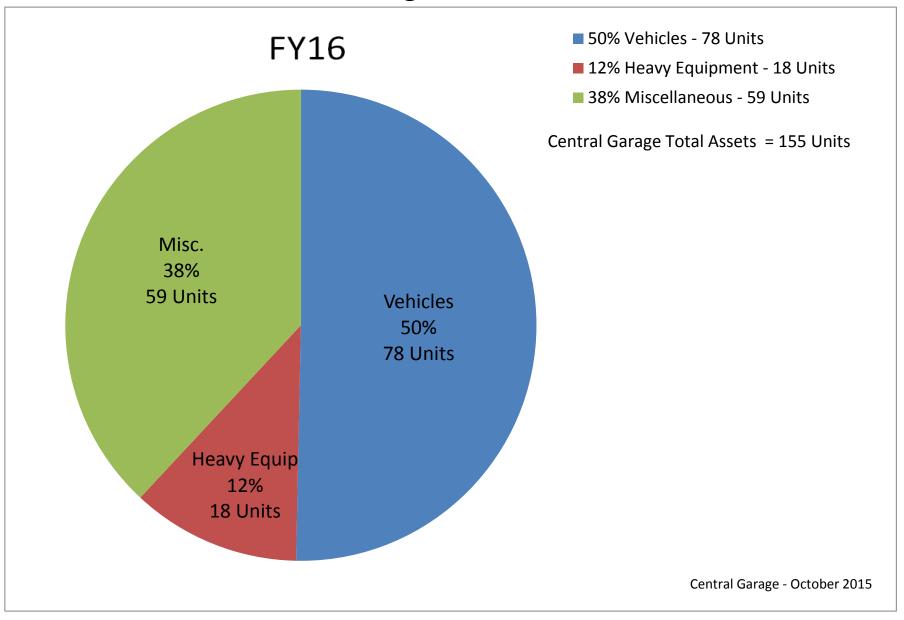




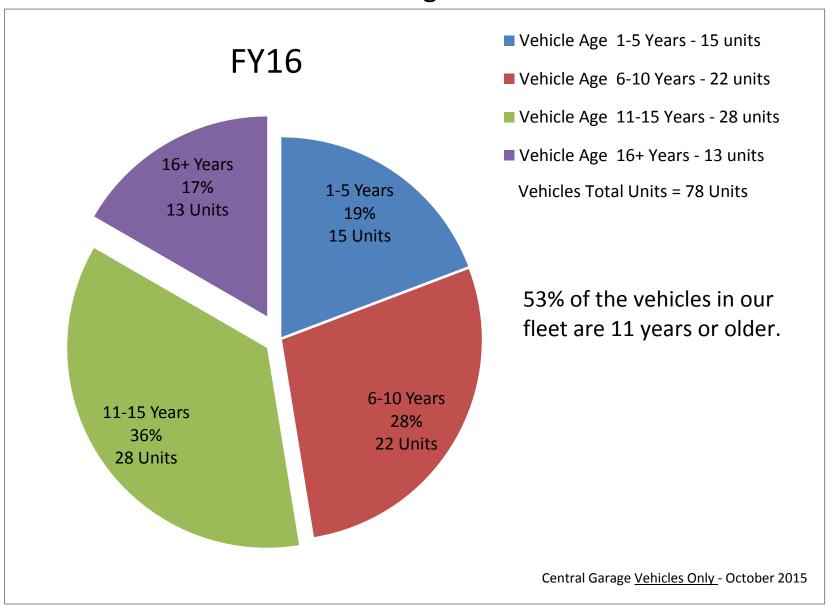
Vehicle Policy Matrix



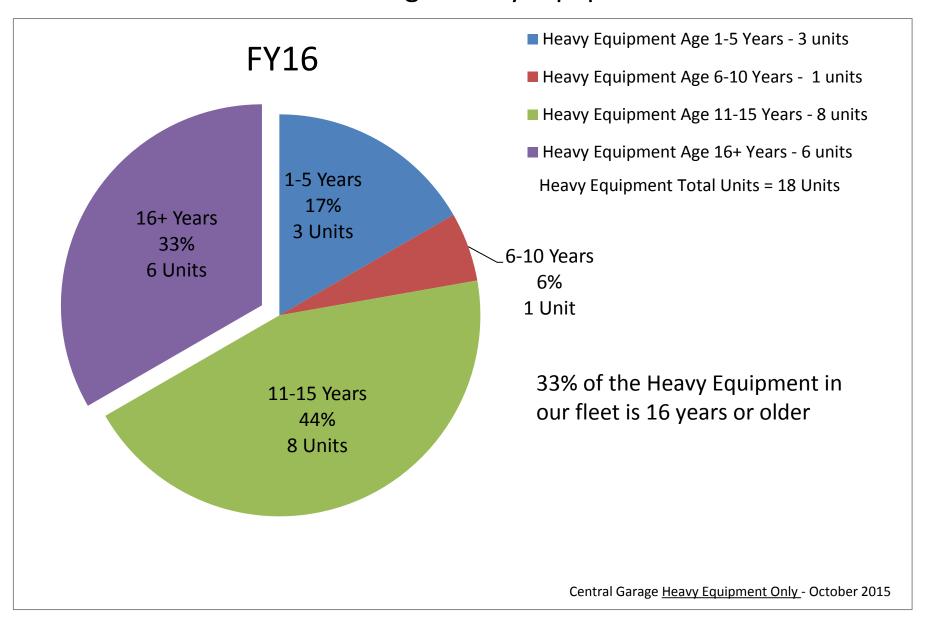
Central Garage Asset Breakdown
