1 2 **Sponsor: Administrator** 3 CITY AND BOROUGH OF SITKA 4 5 **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-29** 6 7 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF SITKA SUPPORTING FULL FUNDING (\$8,236,815) FOR THE STATE OF ALASKA MUNICIPAL HARBOR FACILITY GRANT 8 9 PROGRAM IN THE FY24 STATE CAPITAL BUDGET 10 WHEREAS, the majority of the public boat harbors in Alaska were constructed by the State 11 during the 1960s and 1970s; and 12 13 WHEREAS, these harbor facilities represent critical transportation links and are the 14 15 transportation hubs for waterfront commerce and economic development in Alaskan coastal 16 communities; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the State of Alaska over the past nearly 30 years has transferred ownership of 19 most of these State-owned harbors, many of which were at or near the end of their service life at the time of transfer, to local municipalities; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the municipalities took over this important responsibility even though they knew 22 that these same harbor facilities were in poor condition at the time of transfer due to the state's 23 24 failure to keep up with deferred maintenance; and 25 26 WHEREAS, consequently, when local municipal harbormasters formulated their annual harbor facility budgets, they inherited a major financial burden that their local municipal governments 27 could not afford; and 28 29 WHEREAS, in response to this financial burden, the Governor and the Alaska Legislature 30 passed legislation in 2006, supported by the Alaska Association of Harbormasters and Port Administrators, to create the Municipal Harbor Facility Grant program (AS 29.60.800); and 31 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities utilizes a beneficial 32 33 administrative process to review, score and rank applicants to the Municipal Harbor Facility Grant Program, since state funds may be limited; and 34 35 36 WHEREAS, for each harbor facility grant application, these municipalities have committed to invest 100% of the design and permitting costs and 50% of the construction cost; and 37 38 WHEREAS, the municipalities of the Sitka, Whittier, and Wrangell/Meyers Chuck have 39 40 committed to contribute \$8,236,815 in local match funding for FY2024 towards harbor projects 41 of significant importance locally as required in the Harbor Facility Grant Program; and 42 WHEREAS, completion of these harbor facility projects is dependent on the 50% match from 43 44 the State of Alaska's Municipal Harbor Facility Grant Program; and 45 WHEREAS, during the last fifteen years the Municipal Harbor Facility Grant Program has only 46 47 been fully funded twice; and 48

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WHEREAS, a survey done by the Alaska Municipal League of Alaska's ports and harbors found that from the respondents, the backlog of projects necessary to repair and replace former Stateowned harbors has increased to at least \$500,000,000; and

WHEREAS, given that Alaska is a maritime state and that our harbors are foundational to both our way of life and the economy of this great State it is in the public's best interest to maintain this critical infrastructure by using State, Local and Federal funds to recapitalize the crucial harbor moorage infrastructure statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska Association of Harbormasters and Port Administrators urges full funding in the amount of \$8,236,815 by the Governor and the Alaska Legislature for the State of Alaska's Municipal Harbor Facility Grant Program in the FY 2024 State Capital Budget in order to ensure enhanced safety and economic prosperity among Alaskan coastal communities.
