Explain your main reason for applying:

As a finance professional and businessman, I am concerned about the impacts on the City's financial resources as a result of State's fiscal challenges, rising cost of providing general government services and the cost to replace aging infrastructure in our community. The Assembly has attempted to address these challenges with very specific increases in taxes, services and fees, in my opinion, without consideration of the long-term impact on our economy, affordability to the citizenry and its quality of life.

I am interested in working with the Citizens Task force to develop a plan that will assist the Assembly in a <u>long-term strategic approach</u> in closing the gap between revenues and expenditures that is consistent with community priorities and realistic and attainable revenue sources.

My vision and thoughts of the process is that it would, at a minimum, include the following:

- 1. A candid and open discussion with the community to identify and prioritize the level of service, infrastructure and "ideal" size of government the community desires,
- 2. Determine the cost of providing those services and infrastructure and,
- 3. Determine sources of funding, whether it is taxes, fees, special assessments, or other sources.

Besides the fact I deeply care for our community, its affordability and quality of life; I have an extensive background in business management, finance and accounting that spans over 30 years. My professional career includes work in public, governmental, private, and non-profit accounting, business ownership and retail management and operations.

Some, however, are injured so severely they could not survive in the wild even after rehabilitation.
