Our Opportunity

Problem Worth Solving

Unsheltered men facing cold and wet winter sleeping conditions with threat of hypothermia and possible physical assault.

Provide basic care in a warm and dry facility meant for sleeping during the worst winter months of October through April.

Our Solution

Salvation Army planned for a shelter but did not open their church sanctuary last winter.

SHC shelter will offer a reliable option with trained volunteers who have established on-going relationships with the unsheltered men.

Resources Needed

- 1. Month-to-Month lease of Sisters Lane from City of Sitka and placement of portable structure with interior work & outside decking.
- 2. City utilities hook-up.





Not-Complete History of Working to Shelter the Unsheltered Sitka 2019

- From 1899, when it was constructed until about five years ago, St. Peter's Episcopal Church sanctuary was left open for night shelter.
- Elder Marjorie Ward remembers in the 1950s that the City built bunks and put oil stove in an abandoned house near the Pioneer Bar and it was always open. for shelter. This may have been the house called Snake Pit I.
- After the demise of Snake Pit I (from fire?), sheltering was taken in a house located behind the Pioneer Bar and was called Snake Pit II
- * The Easter Group, in 2013, created a Strategic Plan to shelter unsheltered Sitkans that had as its goal the construction of transitional housing in concert with Baranof Island Housing Authority. The group appears to have never launched this Plan.
- * A small group of STA tribal citizens banded together to work towards creating shelter for unsheltered Sitkans. Participants included Fran Abeyta, MaryAnn Abeyta-Nells, Ange Grant and Jason Mears.
- * Sitka Homeless Coalition formed in August 2017. Joined with the Presbyterian Church group which was also working on sheltering the unsheltered at that time. In December 2017, this merged group planned to take

CUP application to the Planning Commission but withdrew the application prior to the meeting as the Presbyterians found themselves in the midst of disbanding their congregation.

- * Early 2018, the Sitka Homeless Coalition incorporated. Exhaustive Internet research to identify "best practices" for winter night shelters.
- * SHC Board identified and began meeting May 2018.
- * Brian Wilson from Alaska Coalition on Housing and Homelessness came to meet with Sitkans in late June, 2018. Two well-attended community meetings.
- * August 2018 SHC began exhaustive campaign to identify suitable shelter location. 41 buildings approached.
 Owners of some locations approached 2/3x.
- * Late August 2018 Application seeking non-profit status
- * December 2018 With no shelter location located, SHC instituted Showers and Laundry Project. Continuing now 2x weekly with locally donated funding.
- * April 2019 501(c) 3 status awarded retroactive to May, 2018.
- * May 2019 SHC presentations to STA Tribal Council and Sitka City Assembly seeking support for location and structure for winter night shelter.
