Elizabeth Borneman Statement of Interest City and Borough of Sitka Climate Action Task Force

I am interested in a position on the Climate Action Task Force in order to support climate resiliency on a local level. Promoting climate action on this scale is effective to engage community members and others who might be put off by the seemingly impossible task of changing policies at a state, national, or global level.

Sitkans have a wealth of resources that come from knowledge of the land and waters around us, and this passion can be directed into action.

My past work experience in Sitka has taken me from behind the wheel of a tour bus, out to sea as a kayak guide, to the slime line at Sitka Sound Seafoods, watching the hustle and bustle of Lincoln Street as a retail store manager and, finally, to the Sitka Tribe researching the specific vulnerabilities our region faces because of climate change.

My current position and my past experience as a science writer utilize my ability to distill complex and up-to-date scientific information into an accessible format outlining the potential effects of climate change in our region to reach a broad audience. I am interested in the ways in which our community could work to close the gaps in climate research that exist because our region is often left out of the greater climate change conversation.

As an Environmental Specialist I have had the opportunity to participate in the 2020 Southeast Environmental Conference, attend climate resilience training through the Institute of Tribal Environmental Professionals, and attend the EPA's Tribal Science Council meetings as a guest representative. Additionally, I have received training in facilitating climate cafes to engage community members in conversations about the effects of climate change.

My education includes a BA in Psychology and International Relations from the University of Denver, a Master's of Science in Political Psychology from Queen's University in Northern Ireland, and I am currently enrolled as a Fisheries student at UAS.
